What a year we have experienced together at Central!

ould we have imagined God's work over just these last 365 days? Who could forget the 110 recent baptisms, each with its **unique story offering us a fresh encounter with God** at work through our church? And a vibrant church now exists in Columbia, Tennessee, which has seen scores of people come to Christ. How can we measure the eternal destiny of 1,500 people being changed over the last year alone?

Just last week, a single guy teared up as he shared how he'd found Christ, found a support group and was making progress in beating a life-threatening habit. All of this was possible because somebody told him about Celebrate Recovery which led him to timidly walk through the doors one Monday night.

Throughout history, **God has been inviting humanity into the story He is writing**, the plans He has already etched across time. History is full of *kairos* moments – moments of opportunity – where God drew near and invited people into what He was doing. Last year we experienced a significant number of *kairos* moments, and 2022 has been yet another huge year of life change. The stories continue to emerge on how we, as a church, seized the opportunity to **amplify** **the hope and life of Jesus** to those who don't know the Lord.

We have challenges. A number of our thriving ministries are out of space; we know that seats are hard to find on a Monday night at Celebrate Recovery. We desperately need that renovated chapel to continue to make room for what God is doing.

We are a church that is making a difference by giving ourselves

away. We don't have to invest in seeing churches 'built' across our nation. We didn't have to invest over \$100,000 in supporting believers in war-torn Ukraine. We don't have to invest in seeing broken people being made whole, hurting people finding healing, and bound people being set free. We don't have to do any of this; we get to do all this!



We get to do this because of *people like you who generously invest* your time, talents, and treasures into this incredible mission. Thank you. Your investment directly changes lives for eternity. While I do not know who gives what amount, I do know that we, as a church, honor your investment and handle the responsibility with great integrity. 
BAPTIZED At 96

WHEN I ARRIVED AT "LUCY'S" SPARTAN, but tidy, one-bedroom apartment, I found her sitting on her wellworn sofa, the blinds were drawn, the TV was off, and her walker was nearby. I sat next to her, and she wept uncontrollably in my arms as she told me her story.

Lucy had nursed her husband through lung and brain cancer before he died a couple of years ago, and then her only child (a son) died from Covid last Christmas. Various other factors had led to her current isolation--she'd loaned her car long-term to her granddaughter, she had tremendous knee pain, but mostly, she was frozen in her grief and aloneness. We talked, and I prayed and reminded her that God sees her. The second visit was entirely different. The blinds were open, she'd made fruit salad and muffins, she'd lit a candle, and she was smiling. **She told me she felt like she has someone in her corner for the first time and what a huge difference it had made.** Many things have happened since then; I've had many hours of conversation with Lucy, and now I have a volunteer who will be meeting with her regularly. Lucy has her car back and was able to drive to Kollen Park for the first time since her husband died. She recently had a procedure to relieve her knee pain, and she's starting to build her life around her losses. She's talking about going to the library and back to her exercise class at the Aquatic Center. She wants to come to Sunday services and regularly attend her Central bible study.

Lucy still has lots of hills and valleys, but she's slowly moving forward and feels some hope again. I've been reminded that this is the power of presence, and I'm grateful that we're a church that encourages us to find the "Lucys" among us, hold their hearts, help them find connection, and point them to the true Healer and Giver of hope.

n spite of the grief and war in Ukraine, Transformation Church had a special event on September 3. We had the second baptism of the year and were blessed with ten more people who were willing to be baptized, six of those people started attending Transformation Church during the last six months of the war. These are stories from that day:

Lena: "I have been walking by this church daily for 20 years. I have seen the church construction; I have heard the singing and music. **Yet for all those years I was afraid to come in.** Once the war happened, I managed to come inside the church, and it became the place where I found salvation in Jesus Christ, as well as, a new family of God."

Ludmila: "My daughter and granddaughter have attended this church for a while. They were already baptized here and started to serve in the church. However, I didn't have faith and could not believe. Then when the war started, and they started bombing Kyiv with missiles, I came to the basement of the church to hide from the bombings. **Here I heard the Word of God and believed in Jesus Christ.**"

Victoria: "I came to the church to receive humanitarian aid-some groceries and clothes-- and here I heard a sermon and an invitation to attend the Bible class. I began studying the Bible with pleasure, and while I was studying it, God touched my heart, and I repented. Now I can praise God together with you. I am so glad I will be baptized soon.



God has used students like Jordan and Olivia to create a culture of invitation that is spreading. Each week we have seen more of our students inviting their friends. These students have started group chats with other students at


FUEL and text one another every week to remind and encourage them to attend.

From Buddies to assist all ages to participate in Central ministries to The Friendship Class for older students and adults with cognitive disabilities to Night at the Playland – there are many opportunities for those with unique abilities and their families.

"Our son hasn't been able to participate in church for 7 years and we didn't even realize the psychological effect it was having on our family going to church every Sunday without our son. We're so grateful to have a place where our whole family can feel part of a faith community. Central has done a fantastic job of adapting to our son's needs and **simply not giving up on him being a part of the church.**

"This ministry is the reason our family of seven is able to worship together on Sunday mornings. Our daughter is severely cognitively delayed. Without the reliable, safe, loving, and intentional care the team faithfully offers Lexi and others each week, we'd be unable to participate in community as we do. We praise God that families of all different types can engage at Central, knowing that our kids (of all ages and stages) are safe!"



FINDING FREEDOM

A COUPLE OF YEARS AGO, I was introduced to the Wellsprings of Freedom ministry at Central. Our family was going through some struggles, and someone suggested we should each have a session.

During my first three hour prayer and inner healing session, the Holy Spirit led me to a hurt in my past, which was affecting how I handled a situation in my life. From there, the team led me through a powerful time of healing. This included forgiving others, God, and myself.

In addition, I found spiritual healing as I learned to distinguish the voice of the enemy from the voice of the Lord. Through this process, I **uncovered the lies that kept repeating in my head and replaced them with the truth of God's Word.** Over time, as I learned to walk in this freedom, the chatter in my head finally stopped. It was replaced with peace and joy. I have found lasting freedom and am forever changed.





I WAS INVITED BY TWO FRIENDS to attend the women's Bible Study Fellowship program at Central. I had never really been in a comprehensive Bible study before. Well, that was 16 years ago, and I'm still a part of BSF today!

I love that BSF is intergenerational and international-- a discussion group could have women from all over the world of different ages, denominations, and spiritual levels studying the same passages at the same time. My faith has matured and grown through all the different studies that I have completed - some of them repeat studies.

I am truly grateful for BSF and how God has used the studies to shape me and stretched my faith.

I became a children's leader for BSF about 10 years ago. I now get the privilege of teaching God's Word to the next generation. God never ceases to amaze me in my classroom. When God's Word is being taught, the children are attentive and ready to absorb the lesson. Seeing little ones lay their hands on the Bible and telling them, "God's Word is true, and it is true for you", is a highlight of each week. A PLAN TO GIVE



Lynn Bruce CFO + Executive Pastor of Operations e believe the Bible teaches us to honor the Lord through our giving. **Giving is an act of** worship, an expression of gratitude, an investment in the Lord's after work and it is an act of obedience. For all of us – it reflects our relationship with Jesus because where our treasure is our heart will be there also, and giving is one step toward putting Jesus as a higher priority than our possessions.

Although the Bible teaches the concept of tithing, honoring the Lord with the first 10% of our earnings, not everyone is there. Our advice is to begin where you are and take a step closer toward that obedience goal. It is a spiritual journey and the Bible is clear, we cannot out give God. Giving is like planting seeds, God will bless our giving far more than we can imagine.

Central Wesleyan is right now following a vision the Lord has given us for the coming year that will require many of us to give above and beyond our normal giving. This year we need to raise \$1 million beyond our General Budget to help fund the Chapel renovation project, a project that is critical to the call God has put on us for the coming season.

Regardless of where you are in giving, we ask everyone to do the following:

- **PRAY**. Pray about what God is calling you to give it is through prayer that He will lead and guide us.
- **PARTICIPATE**. We will accomplish the vision God has given us corporately only by many of God's people reaching out and seeking God to supply beyond our personal limitation.
- PLAN. Jesus judges the greatest giving not by how much is given but by how much is left. The more our giving includes after sacrifice the greater the blessing of God.


ou can trust the leadership of Central Wesleyan to use strict standards of internal control and accountability. Godhonoring stewardship is at the heart of leadership as it seeks to manage the resources that God provides. The church is managed by the highest standards and discipline in financial management and internal controls.

Not only does the church have levels of internal oversight in its management, it submits to a formal audit by independent auditors that hold the church to the highest standards of general acceptable accounting principles. Audited financial statements are posted online annually as part of leadership's accountability. The church operates by a disciplined budget process in which great care is made to steward resources proved toward the most God-honoring ministries that will work toward fulfilling the vision that He has given the church.

Leadership is committed to doing what it says with resources that people give. Much care is given to honor donor restrictions placed on any gift. Leadership also holds itself accountable for results in reviewing the effectiveness of ministry effort to ensure a good return for the ministry investment that is being made. Leadership understands there are many ways to invest in the Lord's work and there is a passion to be as effective as possible.


