
We don't need a crisis to celebrate and care

It's a relational problem.




Genesis 3:1-7




“You will not certainly die,” the serpent said to the woman. “For God knows that when you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil.”




**The fall did more than make their calling to rule difficult,



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
Force a woman

Creation after the Fall

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
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- **God pronounced the initial state of creation as 'very good'** (*Gen. 1:31*)

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
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- **The very good initial state of creation now operates in a state of futility**


