Filling of the Spirit

1:23: Christ is the fullness of God who fills everything in every way

3:19: Christians can know the God's love and be filled to the fullest measure of God.

4:10: Christ went up for the fullness to come down.

4:13: Christians are to attain to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.

When we allow the Holy Spirit to fill us:

- 1. We speak differently (verse 19a; Col. 3:16-17)
- 2. We live a lifestyle of worship (verse 19b)
- 3. We become more thankful to God for what we have (verse 20)
- 4. And finally, we submit to one another (verse 21).

"Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them..."

Acts 4:8

"After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. And they were filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly."

Four Commands of the Spirit

Two *Positive* commands:

- 1. Be filled with the Spirit (Eph. 5:18)
- 2. Walk by means of the Spirit (Gal. 5:16)

Why be filled and walk by the Spirit?

- 1. God's Word commands it (Eph. 5:18; Gal. 5:16).
- 2. There is no fruit without it (Rom. 7:15-18; 8:3).
- 3. We cannot please God (Rom. 8:5-8; Jer. 17:5).
- 4. We neither grow (Jn. 14:17) nor know (Rom. 8:6)
- 5. We cannot live and minister in power (Eph. 6:10-18).

Four Commands of the Spirit

Two Negative Commands:

- 1. Do not grieve the Holy Spirit (Eph. 4:30)
- 2.Do not quench the Holy Spirit (1 Thess. 5:19)

We grieve the Spirit when we:

- 1. Doubt Him
- 2. Refuse to surrender ourselves to Him
- 3. Fail to listen to His voice (Isaiah 48:18; Ps. 78:10)
- 4. Have a divided heart (James 4:4-5)
- 5. Neglect, pervert, or dishonor God's Word
- 6. Ignore Him
- 7. Are bitter towards another person (Eph 4:29-32)

Five Consequences

- 1. Loss of Fellowship with God (cf. 1 John 1:5-7).
- 2. Divine Discipline (Heb. 12:5-11; Psalm 32:4; 1).
- 3. Loss of Testimony (1 Pet. 2:12-17; 3:15-17; 4:15-16).
- 4. Loss of Rewards (1 Cor. 3:12-15; 2 Cor. 5:10).
- 5. Loss of Fellowship with Believers (2 Thess. 3:6-15; 1 Cor. 5; Matt. 18:17).
