Key Scripture:

Philippians 1:1-5 Acts 2:40-42 Romans 1:1

Big Idea:

Partnerships help us achieve things in Jesus that we can never achieve alone.

- 1. Who do you thank God for every time you think of them? Who causes you to be joyful? Why do these people make such an impression on you?
- 2. The foundation of our partnerships is based a relationship not a practice. Paul rejoices in his partnership in the Gospel. The word partnership is also translated as fellowship twelve times in the New Testament. This reminds us that a Christian partnership is built firmly upon a common relationship we share in Jesus Christ. In what ways has has a common relationship with Jesus helped you partner with other believers? How does a relationship with Jesus unite us?
- 3. According to Romans 1:1, partnerships serve a divine purpose. Our partnerships are to be intentional as well as relational. Can you think of a partnership you have formed that was intentional and bore fruit? What was it about the partnership that enabled you to succeed?
- 4. Partnerships are also strategic. Paul rejoiced in his partnership with the Philippians because it was a church in a strategic location. What strategic partnerships have you had? If you have, in what ways was the partnership strategic.
- 5. With an eye on Philippians, what makes a church partnership strategic?
- 6. As you heard a little of Pastor Sandi's story, what struck you most?
- 7. Would you commit to pray for our strategic church partnerships?
